PASTORAL PONDERINGS

"You will not fear the terror of night, nor the arrow that flies by day, nor the pestilence that stalks in the darkness, nor the plague that destroys at midday." ~ Psalm 91:5-6

I'm looking out my kitchen window at the snow falling, creating a clean white blanket on our deck, and little white pockets among the grass, which actually started peeking out of its dormancy as the weather began to warm. It is peaceful, calm, and relaxing to watch. Something I have been craving over the last couple of weeks.

This scene seems almost out of place given the chaos this big blue marble we call home has been experiencing. As COVID-19 continues to march across the planet, many of us find ourselves afraid, and for good reason, being in the groups which have been most affected. We are human, and fear is part of who we are. Widespread panic seems to be overwhelming when you watch the continuously changing reports—regardless of which news you watch, and yet, if you go to the CDC website, you find straight facts, and nothing about how afraid we should be.

I am not afraid. At least not so much for myself, or even my family. I do worry for those who are most vulnerable: those in the most affected groups; those who are homeless and have no place to self-quarantine if they would need; those who cannot get their meals because the meal site they frequent has shut down; those who live in facilities which are closed to all visitors and can't understand why their loved ones don't come to see them every day, or tuck them into their beds at night; those who are affected by the empty grocery shelves because they can only purchase a little at a time; those who can't afford to get "extra" medicine, or toilet paper; those who have had to stop working because the business has closed and they have no income; and all of the others who are especially vulnerable at this time.

My brother said something to me last week which I reflect on when I begin to fall prey to my own fear. He said, "It must be really hard being the spiritual leader in the middle of the Apocolypse." He was right. But this statement isn't just about me, it's about the wider Church as well. It's a reminder that we are called to care for the most vulnerable at all times, even in our own fear, even when we have to risk something in order to care for them.

While we are going to scale back on our time together physically, we will still be together in Spirit. (See page 2 for further details on how to stay connected, including for worship, during this time.)

For now, let us actively and intentionally seek out ways we can help those in need. If you need personal items or food, or whatever, or you know someone who needs these things, please let me know. If I don't have them, I know I can find them!

For now, *stay diligent in prayer*. We have a long road ahead of us. Our friends and family, our community, our country, and our world will have much to recover from when this has passed. As a faith community, we are the spiritual leaders of this community, therefore let us lead knowing the Spirit is always showing us something new.

Stay well, Friends, and do not fear-and WASH YOUR HANDS !!

STAYING CONNECTED

As we continue to move through this time of "social distancing" or outright "stay at home" orders, we need to continue to connect.

Here are ways you can stay connected to Faith UCC, as well as to one another:

1.) Each Sunday, from now until we are able to gather together, we will hold worship at 10:30 a.m. on Sunday on Facebook Live. Please go to our Facebook page and LIKE it: https://facebook.com/FaithUCCDavenport/
Then watch for the live stream. There is a tag under the bottom of the live stream that says "Watch together with friends or with a group "If you click the STAPT button, it will post on your till

friends or with a group." If you click the START button, it will post on your timeline, and your friends can watch as well. (Because a few of us did that yesterday, Jill's worship has been watched 195 times!)

- 2.) We are offering Bible Study via ZOOM at 10:00 a.m. on Wednesday mornings.
- 3.) Beginning **Monday, March 30**, we will offer three days a week to gather via ZOOM video or phone. Once these are set up, I will send the link, and you will use that same link each time you want to join. These gatherings are for space to decompress, to "be" together, to check in, to laugh, to cry, to pray. You may join for the whole hour, for just a few minutes, one day, two days, or all three days.

Mondays at 2:00 p.m. Wednesdays at 7:00 p.m. Thursdays at 10:00 a.m.

HOW TO JOIN ZOOM

If you have never participated in a ZOOM gathering, it is a place where several people can gather by video (using your PC, iPad, or smart phone). If you are not able to video in, there is a number you can call and you will still be a part of the group.

For Bible Study, I will send an email with the link.

For our "to be together" gatherings, I will send the link with the bulletin this week.

If you are joining from a computer, you must download the application file.

- If you are joining from a mobile device, download the app ZOOM Cloud Meetings from the App/Play Store.
- If an "Application Launcher" or "External Protocol Request" box appears, click "remember my choice" option box and click "OK"
- 1. Click on the ZOOM link you have been provided with.
- 2. (From Computer) you will be prompted how you wish to join your audio. If you are on the computer, click on Join Computer by Audio.
- 3. (From Phone) Call in on the number provided in the link, and enter the meeting ID given to you from the link.

If you have questions, please feel free to contact me, and I will walk you through it! I want you to be able to participate in any way you can, and feel comfortable!


