PASTORAL PONDERINGS

"Forget the former things, nor consider the things of old. Behold, I am doing a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? Isaiah 43:18-19

Is anyone else exhausted? If you say "NO!", I can honestly say, I don't believe you. This pandemic is kicking our behinds! And I don't mean just by those who have been fighting, or have fought this horrible virus, I mean spiritually, emotionally, physically, and psychologically. At one level or another, all of us will come out of this with some form of post traumatic stress.

It makes sense that we are exhausted, everything we knew, everything we did, has changed, and we are having to rebuild. There isn't one aspect of our lives that isn't going to change: going to the doctor, to get our haircut, to get groceries, gatherings for family functions/concerts/sporting events, going to school, and being part of the Church. Everything is having to be rethought, changed, adapted to the "new." And that is HARD work!

During this time, we are grieving. While it's easy to change the things we don't like, it's hard to change things we love. It is also hard to change things that help make our lives easier. But this pandemic has brought to light the cracks in our lives that need to be fixed. We are no longer moving at break-neck speed, which means we can address those areas that need addressing, in our government, in our families, in our faith.

During this time I have spent much time thinking about what it means to re-build the church. Centuries ago we read about disciples who were given the gift of the Holy Spirit to go out and change the world. That gift? Language—the ability to speak more than their own native language. This gift allowed them to move into the parts of the world who had yet to hear the Good News of God's love and grace. That's it. Simple speech—each human speaking, and more importantly, understanding a whole new culture.

As I continue to pray and spend time discerning about the "new church", I think about those disciples, and how very much like them we must be. The people around them judged them, thinking they were drunk at 9:00 a.m., just because they spoke a new language, and had new thoughts. Some even made fun of them, because they didn't understand what was happening.

This is what I see now. I see people with new ideas, new direction and focus, offering new opportunities, but I still see people making fun of them, believing they are crazy for these new thoughts and ideas.

But friends, new times call for new thoughts and ideas. The church is no exception. As we begin to re-open, (we are calling it a soft opening), we are continually coming up with new ideas. Some of those ideas will keep us as safe as we believe we can be (watch for the Guidelines for Returning to In-Person Ministry). Some of them will be a shift in what ministry we focus on (we have access to a data base which will help us—the ROC committee—make phone calls in the neighborhood to check on our neighbors and offer our prayers). Some of the ideas will be a shift in priority—and renewed conversation (from the roof to the sound and video system).

Whatever the ideas, we have a clean slate! We get to start over and build the Church that Jesus started! This is our time! This is God's world. And we have been gifted with a Spirit who is bigger than our church, and more creative than Michaelangelo. And my favorite part is that God is leading it all! Resurrection is among us as we live and breathe. Thanks be to God!

On Tuesday, April 21st, the Quad Cities Interfaith Housing Human Right Campaign task force held a virtual rally on Facebook Live to launch an Eviction Prevention Day of Action. Our call to action asked to develop a plan to prevent the inevitable surge of evictions that will occur when the eviction moratorium is lifted. A week after the rally and call to action, the Davenport city council passed a resolution to develop a tenant based rental assistance program to help people in need, due to the pandemic, with rental assistance. This program will offer up to \$1000/month,

for 3 months, to help pay rent.
