PASTORAL PONDERINGS

"For I know the plans I have for you," declares the Lord, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future. ~ Jeremiah 29:11

Opportunity: *noun*: an appropriate or favorable time or occasion; a situation or condition favorable for attainment of a goal; a good position, chance, or prospect, as for advancement or success.

Every moment of every day we are faced with opportunity. Whether we recognize these moments at any given situation or time depends on whether we view life through the lens of abundance, or of scarcity. Personally, I choose the lens of abundance. This means that regardless of what is happening, good, bad, or otherwise, I understand my choices to offer a chance of learning and growing.



As a collective tribe, and a part of the Body of Christ, we are graced with many opportunities—as long as we choose to view and treat them as such. (If we don't, we *might* begin to feel overwhelmed, and *might* be moved into a position of fear—but that is NOT who we are!)

- *Council—with 2 open position, and an ever evolving way to do and be church in this world, we have the unique opportunity to take a close look at how we govern ourselves, and how that might change to fit who we are as church today. (Watch for continued conversation on this!)
- *Roof—at the annual business meeting, we were presented with a bid to remove the cross above the sanctuary roof, and mount it on a cement slab in front of the church, as well as removing the sky light (which is most likely what is causing our leaks), and re-shingling-which includes adding insulation-which we currently don't have. This project is an immense undertaking (thank you Mick Noteboom for all your hard work in putting this together!), and we will have to figure out how to raise the money—but an unexpected opportunity popped up during the meeting. Do we keep the cross? Or do we go ahead and scrap it? Do we remove the skylight? Do we add insulation? Do we do anything? All of these are opportunities! (See page 3 for a copy of the proposed bid, and watch for the date for the next congregational meeting for this.)
- *ROC—Revitalizing Our Congregation. This campaign is through the Quad Cities Interfaith and being done with a cohort of 7 other local churches. The goal of ROC is to develop our leadership within the church which will result in a cohesive and active congregation whose goals are to: fully proclaim our faith in the public sphere; increase church participation; reach the un-churched; become relevant and significant in the community and have long term sustainability. This campaign has the tools I have been searching for, and it comes with a support group who want the same thing!

(We currently have 2 leaders, but need 3 more. Please see me if you are interested in this. It will be a 1 year commitment.)

*Pledging—(what you commit to giving monetarily for the year 2020) Once again, we are given the opportunity to pray, discern, and commit to giving a portion of all we have been blessed with back to God in order that we may do God's work in this world—the difficult but holy work of justice and peace.

The flip side to opportunity is that not all opportunities are good for, or will fit us as a tribe. Therefore, we must be diligent in listening for and to the still speaking voice of God, and pray for God's guidance. Then, we must make a decision and act upon that. This is God's will and plan for us—to be in relationship with one another and with God.

For these, and all our daily opportunities—easy or challenging; big or small; individual or as a tribe—we have the opportunity to give God our thanks and praise. May we do that with joy and gratitude in our hearts.

Roof Bid

At the October meeting, Council moved to accept a bid to redo the pitched roof over the sanctuary. In reality, this bid consists of 2 bids:

1) Cedar Valley Steel

\$11,150—removal of iron cross from roof, take back to the shop to fix the cross \$11,100—create concrete slab, mount cross in front of the church.

2) White Roofing

\$36.944—includes removal of the skylight, building a peak to cover the hole, add R18 insulation, (currently R3) reshingle with construction grade shingles.

When presented to the congregation at the Annual budget meeting, there were further questions and discussion. The motion was tabled in order to get some answers, and when all of the information is compiled. Watch for date.

*These prices are good until spring of 2020

**There was a question regarding whether we need to insulate the sanctuary.

Based on the US Department of Energy calculation using R3 moving to R21, for a 4500 sq. ft. roof, and using our current cost, the estimated energy savings per year is \$1200, which calculates to a savings of \$36,000 over 30 years—assuming there will never be a gas cost increase.




