PASTORAL PONDERINGS

"And you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free." ~ John 8:32

We—and by "we", I mean "I" - have talked an awful lot about the trials and tribulations of 2020, and we really don't need to rehash them. Yes, that is part of the truth, but there is another part of the truth that we tend to leave out, especially when we are feeling the fear and despair of all that has been thrown at us.

That truth is the continued abundant blessings we have been given, as a world, as a nation, as a community, as a church, and as individuals. I want to share that part of the truth with you here.

WORLD

In this time of chaos and uncertainty, besides our humanity, we now have another thing in common with every single person walking on this planet—the experience of this pandemic. Every single human has their own stories to share about their lived experience. We are not alone!

NATION

We have much to work on as a nation, and even in the difficulties and tragedies that continue to be thrown our way, we have been blessed with the opportunity to begin to make things right—to offer justice and equality in ways that we have been ignoring. In this last storm, I watched our community gather in ways I haven't experienced before. - * Don't respond to texts, emails or calls about checks from the government.
- * **Ignore offers for vaccinations and home test kits.** Scammers are selling products to treat or prevent COVID-19 without proof that they work.
- * Be wary of ads for test kits. Most have not been approved by the FDA, and aren't necessarily accurate.
- * Hang up on robocalls. Scammers use to pitch everything from low-priced health insurance to work-at-home schemes.
- * Watch out for emails claiming to be from the CDC or WHO. Use sites like coronavirus.gov and usa.gov/coronavirus to get the latest information.
- * Do your homework when it comes to donations. Never donate in cash, by gift card, or by wiring.
